John T. Smith Given Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award



John T Smith was recently recognized by the Federal Aviation Administration with the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award. The Master Pilot Award recognizes pilots who have contributed to and maintained safe flight operations for 50 or more years of piloting aircraft.

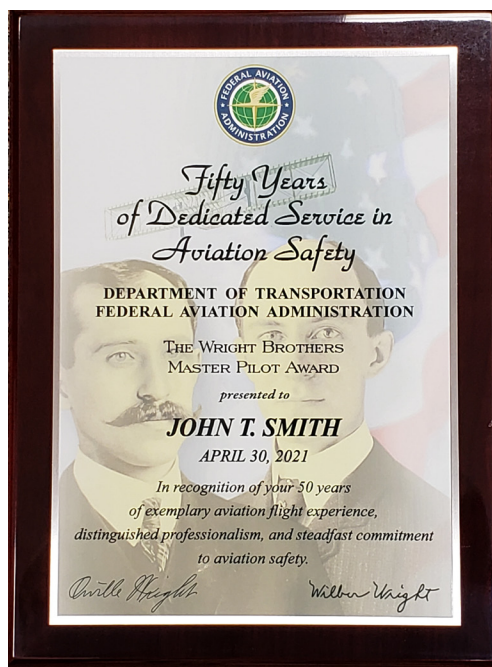
The Master Pilot Award is named in honor of Wilbur and Orville Wright, the two brothers credited with the first powered flight at Kitty Hawk, NC. To be eligible for the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award candidates must have held an FAA pilot certificate with 50 consecutive years or more of U.S. piloting experience. The effective start date for the award being the date of the applicants first solo flight, must be a U.S. citizen, and have at least

three letters of recommendation from holders of FAA pilot certificates.

Smith, of Liberal (Ks), soloed in February 1961 at Lawrence, Kansas while attending college. He earned his Private Pilot license for single-engine aircraft the following June in Anchorage Alaska where he worked the summer for the State of Alaska doing highway surveys. For a new pilot with just 40 hours the change was considerable from the Kansas plains to nearly 22 hours of daylight and mountain terrain. This June marks his 60th year of flying.

Smith bought his first airplane, a 2-passenger Cessna 150 in 1968 after having graduated from college. Over the following years he earned his Commercial license along with mUlti-engine and instrument ratings. He has also owned or partnered in 8-10 aircraft, the most recent being a 6- seat, single engine, Cessna T206H. Smith is still active and has logged about 4400 hours.

When asked what flying has offered him and his family, he was quick to say it was the ability go places, to see and do what is otherwise hard to imagine and accomplish. For him it included flights to both coasts. From above the Artic Circle to the Mayan ruins in Mexico. To the Bahamas Islands. And to even rent a plane in Australia and fly from the eastern Great Barrier Reef through the Outback to the pearl harvesting on the west coast. But often most satisfying is the ability to share the flight experience with those having never been up in a 'small' plane or seen their home or a landmark or natural feature from the perspective of half a mile above it.



JUST A NICE FLIGHT?

Taking off into an 8 mph wind from Cook Airfield (K50) looked to be a nice flying day, little did I know what a roller coaster ride it later would be.

The flight to Moundridge, KS airport (47K) was just a few miles over my 50-mile limit to file a flight plan so prior to takeoff I called 1-800 WX-BRIEF and filed a VFR flight plan. I also had my son follow my flight using Google Location Share. The ground level benign 8 mph wind soon converted to very choppy turbulence until reaching 1000' where it mostly settled down. At cruising altitude, I did enjoy a 25 mph tailwind which pushed my ground speed to 85 mph! Nice!

The scenery was pleasant, cotton candy style clouds, blue sky, color variations in the fields, rows of wind beaks, and numerous interestingly designed rural homesteads and farms. There is beauty in agricultural land even though Kansas has no snow-topped mountains, dashing waterfalls, or wild rivers. In its own right, it is beautiful.

Reaching Moundridge Airport I entered downwind, base leg, and eventually final for the 3000' paved runway. To avoid a long taxi, I landed mid-field then soon turned off at the Bravo taxiway. The EAA Young Eagle flight registration area was my destination. Once there, I was greeted warmly, closed my flight plan, parked my AirBike, and made ready to provide "ground school" using my plane.



My AirBike is very simple and approachable. Just the sight of it encourages kids to get close for a better look. Once within range I ask them if they would like to sit in the cockpit and manipulate the controls. Almost before completing that statement, the first child is already climbing aboard. While seated, I instruct them how to manipulate the controls and depending upon their understanding, I further explain the flight instruments, engine gauges, parachute, machine gun (just kidding) and parts of the engine. I answer their ques-

tions until they are satisfied. Each "cockpit tour" takes about 5 minutes.



Well, that is how it typically works but not this time. There was only one Young Eagle and he went straight for Christine Toev's Titanium Gyrocopter. Once his ride was over his family left. We had no other Young Eagle candidates. It was then determined that a parade, carnival, and other family events were going on downtown, those precluded kids coming to the airport for a Young Eagle ride.

By noon the sponsoring EAA Chapter decided to call it quits. All of us supporting pilots decided to fuel up and go home. The pilot who owned the hangar in which the Young Eagle registration was being held offered me three gallons of his 91 octane no alcohol gas. This made refueling much easier than going to the fuel pumps and trying to manipulate the hose, ladder, and pump meter by myself. I twice offered to pay the pilot but he refused, I thanked him for his contribution to my flight effort. Surprisingly, this has happened several times during my 23 years of AirBike flying and supporting Young Eagles.

The wind at ground level was up to 15 mph, gusting to 20 and at a 20 degree angle off the runway heading. Takeoff, although short, was a little dicey. Immediately after breaking ground I had to crab about 20 degrees to maintain runway heading. At about 50 feet and near the Young Eagle registration table, I let out a stream of smoke to signal my departure. At that point the wild ride home began.

It was a choice between an extremely bumpy low altitude flight at higher speed or a less bumpy ride at 1000' and slower speed. At the higher altitude my speed varied between 45 and 50 mph but was still bumpy. I felt like I was in one of those rickety Wild Mouse roller coaster rides at a very old amusement park. To say the ride was rough was an understatement. Eventually my home airport came into sight, I entered the pattern, made my radio calls, and made a reasonably good landing on the grass runway 19. To avoid a slow taxi

to the turn off point, I kept the tailwheel elevated and “wheelbarrowed” it a couple hundred more yards.

Once the plane was parked in its hangar spot and checked over, I drove home in my pickup truck. That seat and road was much more comfortable than the flight I had just completed. Total airborne time was 2.3 hours. I didn’t realize how fatigued I was until reaching home and collapsing into my recliner. I dozed off for two hours! Even a day later I still feel the effects of that jerky ride. It was either a very rough ride or my sensitivity level gets lower as I age.

Mid-America Air Museum's

Instead of writing a feature on one of the museum's airplanes I thought I would give everyone an update on what is going on at the museum. Every since the month of March started it has been very busy with travelers. We had over 600 alone in the month of March and April and May have been great as well. The museum participates in the "Harvest Host" travel program which enables Harvest Host members to make a reservation for their RV to park one night in the museum's parking lot free of charge in exchange for them visiting our museum. We now are averaging anywhere from three to five RVs a night with visitors from all over the country. The visitors can post reviews and stories about their stay and so far, the reviews are pretty amazing, and the people we are meeting are some of the nicest people you will ever meet.

At long last our F-14 Tomcat has a canopy. On June 9th, 2020 during the 13-hour inland hurricane the 600-pound canopy on the Tomcat somehow managed to blow off and land about 100 feet behind the airplane in pieces. In late October the Navy sent a crew out to inspect the damage and informed us to cut up the frame and we could then get a replacement canopy. Well it didn't quite turn out that way as the Navy told me the next day after we cut the canopy frame up that inspection team had made a mistake and there were no replacements available. Well that didn't stop the museum's restoration technician from welding the pieces of the frame back together, matching the broken edges of hundreds of pieces of the approximately 1/2 inch thick broken LEXAN glass which he glued back together with automotive epoxy, fabricate the missing pieces, fiberglass over it, and then paint the newly restored canopy. On Friday June 4th with the help of a crew from Southern Pioneer Electric and their crane the canopy was put back on the plane. Watching the precision of that crew with their crane is unbelievable. If we needed the canopy moved a 1/2 in any direction they did it with no problem. By the way the canopy now weighs about 700 pounds. Thank You Southern Pioneer!

Probably by the time you see this newsletter we will have hosted the reception for the annual meeting of the Kansas County Commissioners Association for which there will be at least one representative from all 105 counties in Kansas. This will be the first time that I know of that the annual meeting will have taken place in Western Kansas. Thanks Seward County for wanting to hold the reception in our facility to show off the museum. We also will be participating in the Sunflower Summer Learning Program this summer which is a program by the State of Kansas Department of Education with support from the Kansas Department of Tourism, and the Kansas Parks & Recreation Department. This program will allow Kansas students K-12 who sign up for the program free admission to participating attractions such as our museum and the state will reimburse us for the admission fees. As always please come by anytime and visit our museum and see what is going on for yourselves. We are open Tuesday through Saturday from 9am to 6pm with last admissions 30 minutes prior to closing and Sunday's 1pm to 5pm with last admissions 30 minutes from closing. This year we will be open on Sunday July 4th from 9am to 6pm in conjunction with the BJ's fourth of July celebration. Admission will be free that day. Also, please remember that admission for veterans and active duty members of the military are always free here, and we don't charge pilots either but you will have to tell us about the planes you fly (that is always interesting for us). Just taxi to the back of the museum and come in the back door.

My Military Enlistment from October 1960/1963
William(Bill) Cotter
Active duty three years, two years in
Army Ready Reserve.

I was drafted into the US Army, for a period of two years. I lived at Dayton, Ohio, but they needed cadets at Fort Jackson North Carolina. This was an airborne basic camp. Everybody has the same training, up at all hours of the day, consisting of harassment each day. This was 11 weeks of airborne training. That was a life experience that I don't want to repeat.

Once we completed our Basic training, now we belong to the USARMY club. I am a technical person and if I enlist for 3 years I can get Technical Training. I have no desire to jump out of planes, Jungle survival and jungle training. So I enlisted for that extra year. I was assigned to a Nike Hercules Missile base. I was always good in Math, Slide rule and the Technical language. The Battery commander interviewed me for a position in the fire control van as the computer operator. My job during the mission was to acquire the target and lock on the missile. If the battery commander was required to launch my job was to track the missile and target the time to intercept. As a computer operator this was very interesting, and a rare experience. The only targets that we picked up were mostly Dutch commercial airlines, that were off their course due to being lost.

In the three years that I was working at my post on mission we did have 1 Russia MIG that flew over our battery, taking pictures most likely. I was unable to pick up and track the Russia Mig, was lost due to radar forest cutter.

My enlistment was October 1963, rotated back to McGuire airbase where I was discharged. MATTS Military transport back to my home base which was Dayton Ohio. Two years in the Army reserves, 5 years of service which fulfilled my duty to my country.
