Hello Everyone, this month instead of writing an article about a plane in our museum I am writing about a man from Liberal and the artifacts that he and his family donated to this museum that we are making into a temporary exhibit. The exhibit will officially be open to the public (drum roll here) at the EAA Chapter 377 monthly Fly-In here at the Air Museum on September 18th. That's right EAA Chapter 377 members who attend the monthly Fly-In will be the first members of the general public to see

the exhibit. So, in addition to the first 60 people in attendance who will be enjoying a delicious smoked brisket meal complete with mashed potatoes and brown gravy, green beans, and a side salad with a choice of either ranch or blue cheese dressing you will be here for the unveiling. Of course, if any of you wish to bring a dessert please do so and thank you very much in advance. Ok I hope I have been able to peak your curiosity a little bit, and make you wonder who I am talking about, and perhaps tempting you to come to the Fly-In with what is obviously a bribe of delicious food here are some clues. Ever hear of the AVG? How about the Flying Tigers and no I am not talking about the cute stuffed animals we sell in our gift shop? I am talking about the brave men of the American Volunteer Group who battled the Japanese in WWII before the Pearl Harbor was attacked.

Robert (Bob) Tucker was born in Liberal in 1921, and before he had Tucker Men's Wear he was a Flying Tiger. During the war he flew P-39, the P-40, P-47, and the P-51. He was also shot down over China and after successfully bailing out was hidden by Chinese peasants until he was able to make it back to his unit. In 1956 Bob became interested in sail planes and in July of 1973 was instrumental in hosting the 40th U.S. National Soaring Championships right here in Liberal. Bob's role in that event was to be the "Soaring Contest Manager" for the event. Bob passed away in 1995 and his family donated many of his artifacts to the Air Museum. So, if you have ever wanted to see some real Flying Tiger artifacts such as a Flight Jacket, Blood Chit, Gas Mask etc. be sure and come to the Fly-In, oh and by the way did I mention the delicious food?




